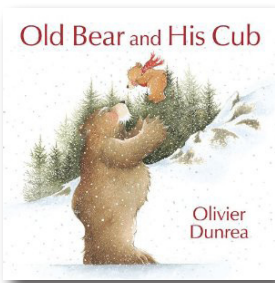


Old Bear and His Cub

By Olivier Dunrea

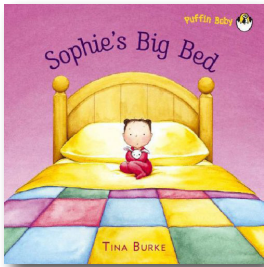
Little bear doesn't like to be told what to do but he complies because he knows Old Bear loves him. Something happens when Old Bear gets sick. What is little bear to do?

Thank You for Me!

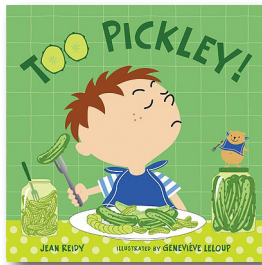
By Marion Dane Bauer

By Jean Reidy

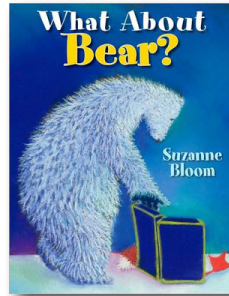
In this rhythmic story a little finicky boy complains about his food being: too pickley, too squishy and too fishy! What happens at the end when there is nothing more to eat?

This is a wonderful story of an amazing little green caterpillar with a voracious appetite that transforms himself into a magnificent butterfly.



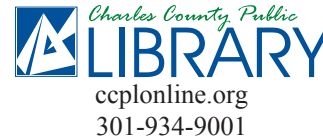
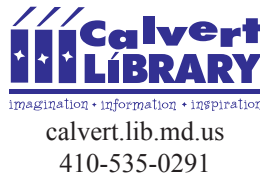
What About Bear?

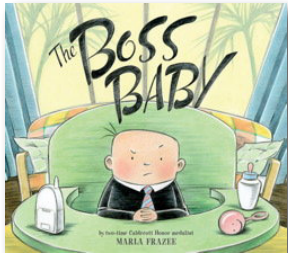

By Marla Frazee

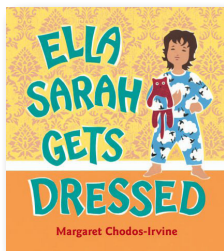

Ella Sara believes she is big enough to dress herself without the help of her parents or older sibling.



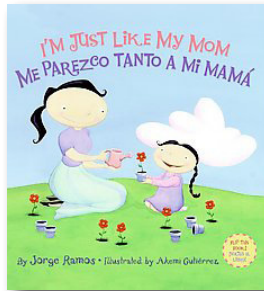
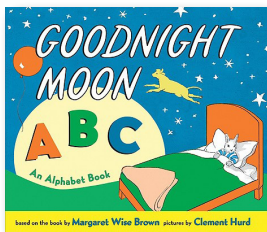
Funny Face By Anna Walker

Kitten gets into all kinds of mischief thinking the moon is a bowl of milk. At the end of all her misadventures she finds a little surprise awaiting her at home.

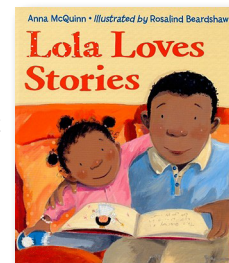
Library Lion By Michelle Knudsen
