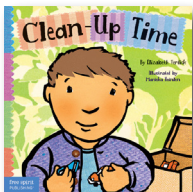


For Older Babies

Learn how to count, color and recite the letters from A to Z with cute and curious Cleo.

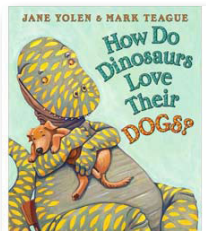
Guess How Much I Love You

How Do Dinosaurs Love their Dogs? By Jane Yolen

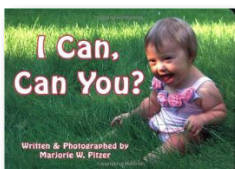
Youngsters will learn patience and gentleness while caring for their beloved dogs.

A delightful board book full of babies and toddlers with Down Syndrome going about their everyday lives.

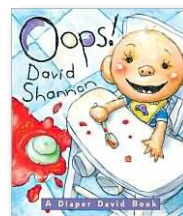
Maisy's Train By Lucy Cousins

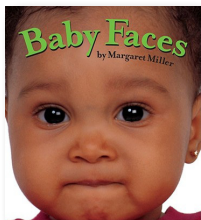

Simple images make a sweet game of "guess what?" with your baby.

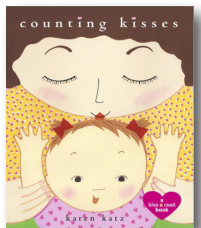


Boy of Mine By Jabari Asim

By Karen Katz

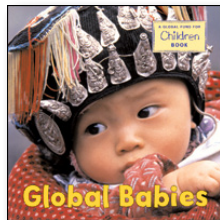
How many kisses does a tired baby need to change her from crying to sleeping?

Sing along with this popular song as you show your baby the gorgeous pictures that help teach parts of the body.

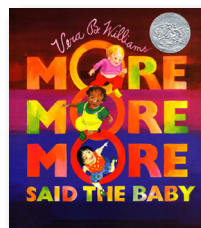
Hop! By Phyllis Root

Snuggle Wuggle

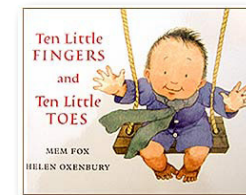
