






Membership is Awesome!




The Scope of Libraries - Not an Advertisement

Different sections house science fiction and crime fiction. We accommodate those with tastes from *Charlotte's Web* to *Fahrenheit 451*, and the entire *Twilight* series for those without it. William Shakespeare's works, repackaged of course, can be found in their incomprehensible brilliance. And then we come to find the works not contained in pages at all. Audiobooks have a place to themselves, and a dais for movies. Even music has found a home, the varieties of which I have not yet sampled. These musical selections include soundtracks, the audiobooks for musicals, in which the greatness of their quality is equal nearly to the sheer shamelessness of my turning a library newsletter article into an advertisement...

Lighthouse Productions at Great Mills High School is performing such a musical. *Into the Woods* tells the story of fairytale characters that all try to achieve their own goals in the sinister forest by their town. The play will be performed April 19th,20th, and 21st at Great Mills High School. The libraries have both the movie adaptation and the soundtrack, but the surest guarantee of quality comes from Lighthouse Productions. I would also like to mention both Leonardtown HIgh School and Chopticon High School, which have their own musicals. Leonardtown's performance of *Anything Goes* will take place on April 27-29 and May 4-6. Chopticon will be performing *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers* on April 5th through 7th.

Last September, Hurricanes Irma and Maria left their mark on the Caribbean. The US Virgin Islands, my hometown of islands, was devastated by both storms. Many schools have been condemned and most are on split sessions to accommodate the extra students. So many teachers lost the contents of their classrooms and are having trouble replacing even basic supplies. We have sent multiple shipments to classrooms in the Virgin Islands but we would love to send more. We are collecting basic supplies such as scissors, paper, and markers. I am also collecting monetary donations so we can purchase and ship specific items from Amazon wish lists so that the classrooms get exactly what is most needed at this time. Director's Discussion

Hello, Friends!

It is my great pleasure to share some wonderful news: On March 6, at the County Commissioners meeting, the construction contract for the NEW Leonardtown Library and Garvey Senior Activities Center will be awarded. Groundbreaking will take place about four to six weeks later.

This project has been in the making for a decade. As many of you know, it has been delayed, changed, and even temporarily abandoned, buffeted by the winds of politics. The location site was for a time a source of acrimonious contention. Throughout the years, however, several things have been constant. First, library employees have given outstanding service and delivered the resources that citizens want, consistently showing that libraries are essential for 21st Century Communities to thrive. Second, you, the Friends of St. Mary's County Library, have given constant support, ensuring that the project would eventually come to fruition.

Once a contract is signed, the project will be all but impossible to stop. We will at last be able to say with some confidence, there will be a new Leonardtown Library

We have many people to thank for this important step forward. Certainly the current group of county commissioners are among them: Randy Guy, Mike Hewitt, Tom Jarboe, Todd Morgan, and John O'Connor have provided great support. Leonardtown Mayor Dan Burris has helped move the project towards approval in Leonardtown. But among those people, you, are friends, are as deserving of thanks as anyone. Thank you for your faith, your energy, your dedication, and your service. You can truly say, "This is MY library." Congratulations to you—it seems we are finally winning through!




