
St. Mary's County Library 2016 Annual Report



Over 1.5M items were circulated during 2016 including adult, teen, and children's books and audiobooks







- Automatic renewals of all materials started
- Kids Cards were launched to provide kids birth age

- The first annual LexiCon, a St. Mary's County Library Comic Con held in October
- Broke attendance records with the Halloween program at the Charlotte Hall Veterans Home
- Formed the St. Mary's County Library Foundation
- One ADA computer station was put into service at each branch, ensuring customers with disabilities have equal access to technology
- Additional security cameras were added at each branch to increase customer and staff safety
- A new self-checkout machine was added at Lexington Park branch
- Color copy prices were reduced
- Fax prices were reduced and the process was simplified for our customers
