In FY2024, St. Mary's County Library launched its new Mobile Library. It has a network of regular stops, including many in more remote areas. Programming began in February, with 7,510 people having used our Outreach services from then to the end of June.

The Library provides access to over 60 online resources including Mango Languages, test preparation and homework help services, and a variety of resources on topics such as genealogy (even Ancestry.com), hobbies, finance, and auto repair.

Events included professional performances, classes on topics such as crafting,3D printing, archaeology, STEM, Artificial Intelligence, and more; book discussions, children's programs, and several nationally recognized experts and authors. The three Library locations opened SEED Libraries that have given out over 2,500 seed packets to over 400 community members.

Our computers had nearly 33,746 sessions logged and our free WiFi was accessed 20,566 times.

Our digital checkouts increased by 22% in just one year. We added access to The Shelf, which offers thousands of Spanish language movies, television shows, and live performances and American Mosaic, which provides access to The African American Experience, The American Indian Experience, The Asian American Experience, and The Latino American Experience.

All three Library buildings now have Memory Labs which allows customers to take physical memories and make them digital for free! VHS tapes, cassettes, film negatives, slides, photos, and documents can all be converted to digital files in just a few simple steps. Through a generous donation from our Friends of the St. Mary's County Library, Lexington Park Library got new shelving to help with accessibility and made room for a future makerspace. The collection was not significantly changed, it was just reorganized the books made more accessible. Monthly circulation has increased since the move.

External partnerships continue to be important. This year brought some grant activity. The Leonardtown Rotary and SMECO partnered with the Leonardtown Library and Charlotte Hall Library to install new Storywalks through a \$9,500 Rotary grant. The St. Mary's County Arts Council provided \$12,000 in grant funding for arts programming at our branches and Mobile Library. Ayana Proctor, a noted artist of the Piscataway Nation, received grant funding from the Council to provide a painting for the Leonardtown Library Maryland History Room. The Friends of St. Clements Bay with library support received a \$50,000 Maryland Arts Grant to install mosaic murals of native species in the community garden in front of the Leonardtown Library. The artwork will be installed in October of 2024.
