Palace, Libby, and hoopla provided hundreds of thousands of eBooks, eAudiobooks, eMagazines, movies, music, and more all available to stream or download onto your device.

In FY 2025, we added over 5,000 always available audiobooks and a collection of exclusive content from Audible to Palace.

331,501 visits to our Libraries in FY2025

We provided 1,749 free events that 35,535 people attended. Our attendance for events was up 15% over last year! In addition, we participated in 185 outreach events reaching 10,222 additional community members.

Events included professional performances, classes on topics such as crafting, 3D printing, gardening, archaeology, STEM, and more; book discussions, children's programs, and several nationally recognized experts and authors.

Our Meeting Room and Study Room Use Increased by 5% in FY 2025

Meeting rooms and quiet study rooms are free and available for the public to use for meetings, parties, study groups, and so much more! In FY25, 1,876 groups used the meeting rooms and 5,525 individuals or groups used study rooms for a total of 7,692 sessions.

St. Mary's County Library has 35,436 active card holders

Library cards are free and you can register online or in any of our locations. Library cards allow you to check out 75 items at a time and use all of our online resources.

Kids' Cards and SMCPS SMART Cards are special cards available for our youngest residents under the age of 18, to help get library cards in the hands of children and encourage reading. All SMCPS students receive a SMART card number (unless parents choose to opt out).

Our Mobile Library is loved by the whole community!

Our Mobile Library team held 136 community stops, and with help from Library staff, attended 319 events throughout the County. All together, we visited over 18,000 community members this year.

We continue to provide vital technology access.

Our free-to-use public computers have internet access and Microsoft Office, and we have workstations at each location that provide assistive technology to citizens of Maryland protected by the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

Our computers had nearly 33,000 sessions logged.
In addition to computers, we offer all visitors free WiFi and we have **printers** at each location that can print full color, **scanners**, **faxing** capability, and **laptops** that can be checked out to use in the Library.

Need to take your internet home? **We checked out 2,589 mobile hotspots** to customers in FY 2025, an 86% increase over FY 2024!

It's been an unforgettable year!

On July 1, 2025 St. Mary's County Library officially went Fine Free! The new fine free policy will ensure that all St. Mary's County Library residents have access to the Library's resources and services, while eliminating the financial barrier of overdue fines.

Charlotte Hall Library and Lexington Park Library updated the audio visual equipment in all meeting rooms.

St. Mary's County Library was awarded \$14,000 through the Public Library Association to hold nearly 50 computer classes and digital literacy trainings.

Leonardtown Library held several Indigenous
History events in partnership with the
Piscataway Tribe and acquired several
unique pieces of art that will be on
permanent display in the Maryland Room.

Friends of the St. Mary's County Library held two very successful book sales during FY 2025, and have raised over \$974,000 and counting for St. Mary's County Library.

And there's more!

Lexington Park Library raised \$96,000 for a new family-focused Makerspace! A matching TEDCO grant was awarded in mid-2025 that will allow the space to start construction in early 2026.

Lexington Park Library has already purchased many of the pieces of equipment for the Makerspace including pottery wheels, chompsaw, glowforge, large format printer, and so much more! Watch for upcoming events to try out the equipment!

Leonardtown Library's Makerspace added two new 3D Printers. Charlotte Hall Library and Lexington Park Library each added a new 3D Printer.
