### FOL Annual Dinner



### from the Library

Through a generous donation from the Friends of the Library, St. Mary's County Library is excited to present Hoopla! Library customers can now stream thousands of movies, TV shows, audiobooks and music for free with no wait or holds! With a valid St. Mary's County Library card, any customer may download the free hoopla digital mobile app on their Android or IOS device or visit hoopladigital.com to browse thousands of titles – from major Hollywood studios, record companies and publishers – available to borrow for instant streaming or temporary downloading to their smartphones, tablets and computers.

As of April 8, over 500 customers have registered with Hoopla borrowing almost 850 items! Customers are able to borrow up to six hoopla selections per month with their library cards. Movies and television shows are available on patrons' devices for three days after check out. Music is available for seven days. Audiobooks are available 21 days. Customers don't need to return or worry about their borrowed items; Hoopla will automatically return checked-out items. No late fees or waiting to borrow popular movies, TV shows, albums or audiobooks. Please talk with your library staff if you have any questions or problems with the process.

Don't forget about Summer Reading! This year's theme is 'Every Hero Has a Story!' Babies, kids, teens and adults all have a program this year! The adult program is in partnership with St. Mary's College of Maryland. All programs start the week of June 22 and help kids maintain their reading skills during the summer. Babies through teens can participate and earn prizes by completing fun reading activities. The Professional Performance series will kick off June 29. A complete list of summer programs will be available at any branch or online.



Sally and her husband Geoffrey, own and run P.A. Bowen Farmstead in Brandywine, Maryland. They hope it will serve as a model for other farms, inspiring farmers—both established and new- to produce an abundance of naturally raised foods and bring prosperity to

Southern Maryland and to farming communities throughout the U.S.


# Have you "hoopla-d"?



Hello everyone!

Once again, the annual FOL book sale was a huge success! Our members and community supporters braved cold temperatures, rain, and mud to join us at the fairgrounds to help make another record breaking sale. It just keeps on getting better each year.

We want to send out a big thank you to the members who donated books throughout the year. An especially HUGE thank you goes out to all of the volunteers who put in so many hours in sorting and moving the books, as well as setting up and working at the book sale. More than 136 volunteers put in over 1650 hours between moving day and the end of the sale. During the rest of the year, a core group of volunteers average over 115 hours per month (roughly 1380 hours annually) sorting and packing up the books. That's more than 3000 volunteer hours combined, which all goes into having such a successful sale! We'd also like to give a big thank you to John Richards and Robert Trossbach for all of their help in getting the buildings ready at the fairgrounds.


